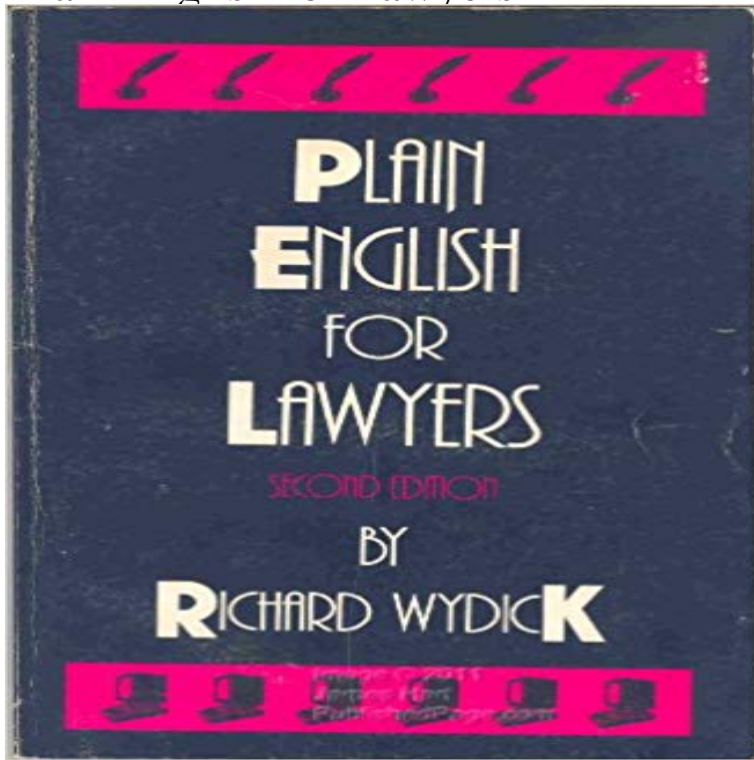


Plain English for Lawyers
