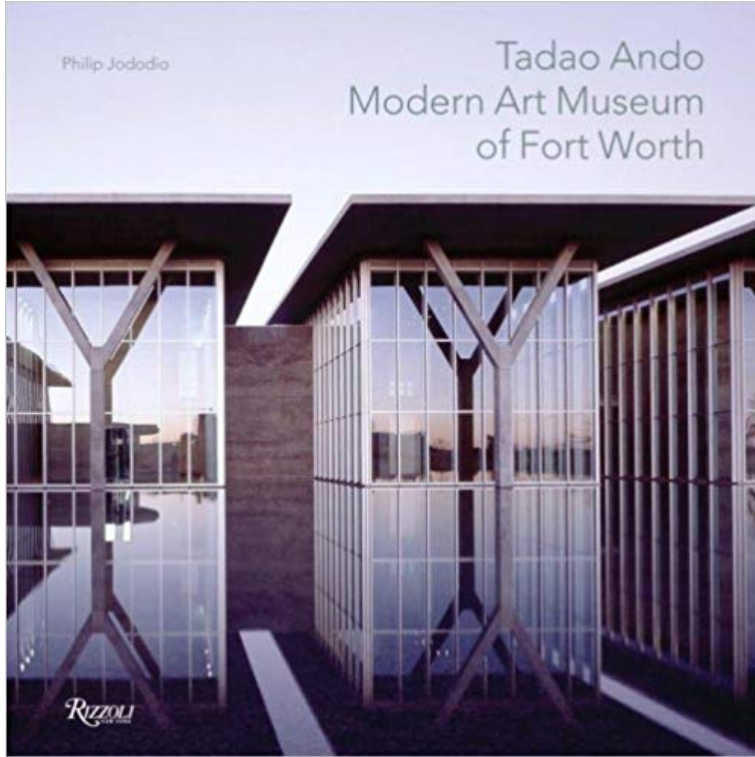


Tadao Ando Modern Art Museum of Ft. Worth
